What is a roundabout?

A roundabout is a one-way, counter-clockwise circular intersection that uses signs and pavement markings to guide motorists around them. They do not have traffic signals. Roundabouts have safe crossings for pedestrians and bicyclists.

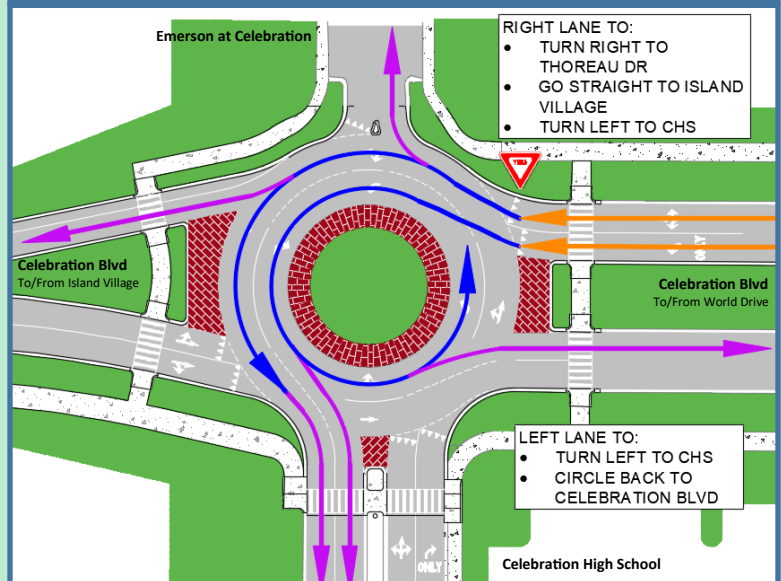
Roundabout Rules of the Road

- ◆ Slow down to 20 mph
- ◆ Choose lane according to your exit
- ◆ Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks
- ◆ Yield to vehicles & bicycles already in the roundabout
- ◆ Travel slowly, counter-clockwise in roundabout:
 - ◆ **DO NOT STOP; DO NOT PASS**
 - ◆ **STAY IN YOUR LANE**
 - ◆ Use turn signals
 - ◆ Outside lane- yield to inside lane as they may turn right
- ◆ As you exit carefully:
 - ◆ Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks
- ◆ Give big vehicles (like buses) extra room; they may need both lanes
- ◆ When in doubt, go around slowly, and look to carefully exit the roundabout.
